

The Very Reverend Angus J. MacQueen

Anniversary Sunday, November 16, 1992 by: John J. Eberhard, Chairman, Official Board

It was The Very Rev. Dr. Angus J. MacQueen who wrote: "It is our past that defines who we are.... It is our past that gives our lives continuity", and when he contemplated his own past in his recently published diary, he added: "It also gave me my spiritual and ethical values --- and my faith."

On the occasion of our 160th Anniversary, Dr. MacQueen will return to remind us of our proud history and offer to us once again from his profound insights.

While many of us have special and personal memories of his 13 years here, there are more among us now those who know him only by his esteemed reputation.

Dr. MacQueen, B.A., B.D., D.D., LL.D., was born in Cape Breton Island. Following graduation from Mount Allison University with first class honours, Pine Hill Divinity Hall in Halifax provided a springboard from Systematic Theology to ordination in 1935. He was awarded his Doctorates, honoris causa, by Pine Hill, Victoria University, Toronto and the LL.D. by Mount Allison and the University of Western Ontario.

Dr. MacQueen began his ministry as Assistant and later Interim Minister at St. Andrew's United in Sydney. It was there as a young man that an influence would begin a distraction which would last a lifetime. Her name was Netta MacFadyen, before it became Netta MacQueen. Said Angus: "My major indebtedness is to my wife, who has always been my most truthful and trustworthy critic."

The MacQueens served pastorates in Port Hawksbury, Antigonish, Saint John, Edmonton and St. George's in Toronto. The family of six came to First-St. Andrew's in London in 1951.

There are so many stories and happy times to be recounted from the thirteen wonderful years which he provided for this congregation. To get a sense for the depth of the man and his ministry, explore his recent volume entitled: *Memory is My Diary*.

This autobiography confirms that Angus MacQueen is perhaps the best read man, not only in the United Church, but in all of Canada. That probably explains why when he initiated the reconstruction of our Sunday School wing and chapel in 1955, he included what the late George Goth called the finest study in Christendom. It holds

more books than any other Minister's Study in the United Church!

These volumes indicate the astonishing scope of his reading. His own biographer reminds all who have known him, that his sharp mind, his vision and his convictions make him one of the finest Preachers in the history of the United Church.

I recall a probing and thoughtful mind which shared, in sometimes provocative ways, views on some of the most basic problems of human existence. He would interweave science and technology, humanism and theology with the problems of contemporary moral dilemma. Out of intellectually indefensible contradictions, he would intricately fashion pragmatic Christian advice, not meant to "confound the Mighty" but to remind people of the faith - his congregations, and a wider audience, of the eternal truths.

His sermons are masterpieces. With frequent reference to Paul Tillich, Aldous Huxley, Leslie Weatherhead, Reinhold Niebuhr, C.S. Lewis, Dostoyevski, Jean Paul Sartre, Emerson Fosdick and others, he consistently stimulated his congregations.

From our pulpit an unprecedented venture in evangelism was initiated by Dr. MacQueen. It was here that broadcast Ministries were invented. Not only were 400-500 people attracted to our Sunday evening services each week but tens of thousands from Georgian Bay to New York tuned in each week.

The radio audience looked forward each year, as did we all, to the Christmas Eve service when Angus would describe in minute and colourful detail the sanctuary decorations from the candle light bathed poinsettias to the decorated towering twin scotch pines. His description was so meticulous that the listening audience could feel the warmth of the many candles of that special service!

Dr. MacQueen had a lot of time for the kids in the neighbourhood. It was during his tenure that a part-time Christian Education staff person was first hired. An innercity youth program attracted between 75 and 100 boys each day to play basketball and floor hockey. Many later became members of the Church.

By the late 1950's, Dr. MacQueen was becoming very much involved with the wider church. Starting as the Chairman of the Board of Evangelism, it was not long before his reputation earned him the distinction of being elected Moderator of the United Church of Canada in 1958. We were very proud to support him at that time as a congregation.

We are very happy to welcome Dr. Angus J. MacQueen back to his pulpit here at First-St. Andrew's United Church.

A New Year, And New Leadership

Rejoice! Renew! Reach Out!

At the annual meeting of the Congregation for the year 1991, the Official Board — was directed to formulate a plan to implement a Council form of administration. This is intended to replace the Official Board and follows the lead of General Council in authorizing systems of local organization which are more contemporary, effective and efficient than the present system.

A proposed statement of policies and procedure has been prepared. This document describes the "Council". It sets out the administrative and staff functions and lists the volunteer responsibilities. The responsibilities and extent of authority assumed by committees have been clarified.

We have always recognized some basic constitutional and democratic principles within our own congregation. Central among these, we hold that the process of choosing leaders within the church should be an empowerment of the congregation. This object has been addressed in the new policy.

Any church government must necessarily reflect all the required functions and responsibilities outlined in the United Church Manual. The "Council" system of church government includes all the key elements. Members of Council will be representative of and derived from the Committees which perform the spectrum of services on behalf of the congregation. All of the tasks presently performed by lay people will be continued. Leaders within the Council will be the chairpersons of a major committee

of the congregation from which s/he would be appointed. Service for members of Committees would be established on a fixed term of office. In some, a rotating election process will provide for continuity. A Nominating Committee is responsible for developing, with the help of existing Committees, a slate of nominees to fill roles as church officers and officials, and to accept the chairs of the many congregational committees (approximately 70) and activity groups (approximately 36).

The chairperson of the Nominating Committee is Aggie Ramsden. She and her Committee will be canvassing the congregation between now and the annual congregational meeting to receive the commitments of those presently serving and new members who will form the group of Elders to be elected for next year. Positions to be filled include:

(Committees) Nominating Committee, Trustees, Christian Development, Finance, Growth and Nurture, Ministry & Personnel, Outreach, Music, Property and Administration, Stewardship, Volunteer Management and Worship.

(Officers and Officials) Presbytery Representatives, Church Treasurer, Chairperson of the Church Council, Chairperson-Elect of the Church Council, Secretary of The Church Council.

During this transition year, it is important to ensure that all those interested in serving in any way within our Church family be given that opportunity. Please assist us with the large task of preparing a slate of committee members by making yourself known to the Nominating Committee. Ideally, every member would be involved in one way or another in the life and work of our church. We need your help. *Please enlist!*

AN OPEN LETTER TO FSA FROM ALDIS MURRAY

Because people from the church have been so good to me, I feel like I am sort of a member of FSA. However, my mobility impairment makes it very difficult for me to access the building for any church activities. On November 8, I made an extra effort to attend the presentation made by the Access Committee following the regular church service. I rode my scooter over to the church and had to wait 15 or 20 minutes at the door until someone happened to come out. I asked the lady to get one of the ushers inside, which she did. Two gentlemen came out and directed me to the side door (which I am unable to open by myself). They assisted me in using the elevator chair; at the top, I had to walk as best I could to the front pew because my scooter is too heavy and bulky to get up the stairs. I was impressed with the plans for the new addition and fervently hope that everyone recognizes the need. I look back over the past few months and know that a better entrance, and an elevator, would have made a big difference at my father's funeral when we had two wheelchairs and a walker to cope with; also, at my niece's wedding, when we struggled with three wheelchairs, a walker, and a lift that gave out in the middle of a ride. People are always very kind and helpful, but they need the proper tools to work with. We are living in a modern age, and everything has to be updated, from our thinking to our physical facilities. First-St. Andrew's is a great place to come to -- please make it accessible to everyone.
